Rose Aten at RDG Kitchen & Bath took the Georges' wish list of appliances and basically pulled the room together. A

center island, complete with a prep sink and a garbage disposal, helps establish the work triangle. There is a warming drawer directly across from the stove, a stacked microwave and convection oven, and two big drawers for storing large pots and pans. "She even used the spaces that are usually wasted," says Diana of her kitchen designer. Instead of closing off the cabinet nooks, Aten built in spaces for efficient storage of everything from cookie sheets to spices. A pass-through to the formal dining room eliminates having to walk all the way around with heavy plates of food.

Throughout the home, comfort and elegance combine in unexpected ways. A fireplace in the master suite, for example, opens on one side to the bedroom and on

the other just above the spa tub. The ceiling in Jim's office is a bold pattern of wood beams interlocked against framed bead-board. Arched doorways, window frames, and casework establish the Mediterranean motif, while the incredible views through the many large windows create a constantly changing work of art.

H2 Builders do their projects entirely in-house, and Cameron credits his craftsmen for their attention to the details that make this home so beautiful. From the framing to the millwork, the floors to the ceiling, everything was 100 percent custom-made.

As the Georges transition from the working world to a more relaxing lifestyle, they have already been embraced by a lovely new Mediterranean villa and also by the neighbors who call Berkeley Hall "home."
